POSTGAME NOTES

- -Captains for UMS-Wright: senior WR T.J. Dixon, senior DB Sam Pettway, senior DL Christopher Quinnelly and senior OL Gus Addison
- -Captains for Oneonta: senior senior QB/DB Cody O-Toole, senior WR/DB Alvin Scott, senior OL/DL Casey Hunt and senior OL/DL Blaise Brown
- -Oneonta won the coin toss and elected to receive
- -UMS-Wright won the sixth state championship in school history. The Bulldogs previously won the state championship in 1987, 2001, 2002, 2005 and 2008.
- -UMS-Wright improves to 5-1 in Super 6 appearances while Oneonta falls to 1-3.
- -Oneonta senior wide receiver Alvin Scott finished the game with 11 receptions for 123 yards, breaking the Super 6 4A record for receptions in a game. The previous record was held by Jaren Johnson of Jackson High School set in 2011 against Oneonta
- -Oneonta senior quarterback Cody O-Toole set a Super 6 4A record with 22 pass completions. The previous high was 20 by Spencer Pennington of Fayette County in 2000.
- -Oneonta tied a Super 6 4A record with 24 first downs in the game, tying Deshler's total in 2010.

UMS-Wright head coach Terry Curtis:

Unbelievable I could not be more proud of this group of young men. If you could only have seen us at the beginning of the season you would see how far we have come. I thought being physical up front was the key. I also think that play (Oneonta fumble) right before the half was the turning point in the game.

(On wide receiver Troy Dixon) I have had a lot of great wide receiver over the years but never one like T.J. Dixon.

Troy Dixon (wide receiver, #1)

This is unreal, it really is! Our line did a great job. They worked extremely hard all week and really came out and executed today. Our running game sort of found its bread and butter late in the game.

Oneonta head coach Don Jacobs:
