

# 2013 AHSAA Super 6 Championships

Class 1A Final: #2 Maplesville (14-1) 12, vs. #1 Pickens County (15-0) 38

- Maplesville won the toss and elected to receive.
- This marks the first state championship for Pickens County.
- Pickens County set a 1A championship game record with 441 yards rushing, breaking the previous total of 369 by Maplesville against Lynn in 1996.
- Pickens County running back Jermarcus Brown also set the 1A championship game rushing record with 329 yards rushing, breaking the previous total of 306 set by Lee Cable of Lynn in 1996.
- Pickens County also set a 1A Championship Game record with 471 yards of total offense, breaking the previous record of 432 set by Maplesville set in 1996.
- The two teams combined for 799 yards of total yards, a new record for the 1A Championship Game. The previous mark was 768 set by Maplesville and Lynn in 1996.
- The two teams combined to score 56 points, the most combined points in the 1A Championship Game since Reeltown (46) and Notasulga (6) combined for 52 in 2001.
- Maplesville entered the game averaging 52.4 points per game and was limited to just 18 points on the game. It marks the fewest points the Red Devils have score in a game since being held to 27 against Sweet Water on Sept. 27.
- Maplesville had allowed a total of 15 points in the playoffs entering the championship game and for the season gave up an average of 7.3 points per game. The 38 points scored by Pickens County marks the most points an opposing team has scored against the Red Devils.
- Maplesville finishes the season with 751 points scored on the season, the third most points scored by a school in one season in AHSAA history.

Pickens County head coach Patrick Plott:
